- **Public Works-Travis Walker**
 - Two trucks down, only one salt truck is working. Working on repairs and should have them both back by Thursday.

 - Working on adding some new equipment and trucks to the public works fleet for the budget. Looking at asphalt trucks; crack fill machine and possible pro-patcher. Also working on a street maintenance program.

 - Working on policy/procedure manual.
 - Working on emergency management plan.
 - Charger ordered.

 - Working on a neighborhood security camera program. This program is free of charge and allows the citizens to provide surveillance footage needed during the course of an investigation. It's confidential and we only use what the citizens allow.
